# Visiting Irish Poet Read from Debut Collection

Visiting Irish poet Annemarie Ní Churreáin read from her debut collection *Bloodroot* (Doire Press, 2017). Dedicated to the poet's foremothers, the collection of poems explores the buried histories of violence and silencing imposed upon women by the Irish state, recounting the intergenerational grief of family separation and adoption loss, as well as the intimate ties of kinship that continue to sustain women's lives in Ireland.
