

MA Medieval Studies

Fall, 1st Semester

- Engl 500 is required your 1st term
- Engl 530 is required your 1st term if you are a TA
- Begin to think about Latin Language Requirement
- Get in the habit of checking email regularly for important information

Spring, 2nd Semester

- Begin discussions with faculty about COS Chair/Committee
- Begin discussions about Portfolio form, structure, style, and content with COS

Fall, 3rd Semester

- File **Appointment of Committee on Studies (COS)** form (English Department form)

Spring, 4th Semester

- If ready to take Master's examination, file **Program of Studies** form to GS prior to taking exam
- If ready, take Medieval Master's Examination, 3rd Monday in February. If not, take next term (take after 24 hours and language requirement met)
- File **Announcement of Examination** form with GS two weeks before exam (two weeks before 3rd Monday in February)

Fall, 5th Semester

- If Master's Exam not taken previous term, file **Program of Studies** form to GS by October 1st for spring graduation next term
- If Master's Exam not taken previous term, take this term on the 3rd Monday in September
- File **Announcement of Examination** form with GS two weeks before exam (two weeks before 3rd Monday in September)

Spring, 6th Semester

-Finalize Portfolio

-Present passing Portfolio to faculty, fellow students, and guests in open forum

-COS Chair will record and submit **Report of Examination** to GS by April 15th for Spring graduation

-Graduate!

There is no petition for the 15th of the month final deadlines. Students who complete requirements after the deadline but before the end of that term can ask to invoke the GS Courtesy Policy. This means you don't have to register for classes the following term, but your graduation will be moved to that next term.
